Another *Burks* Cousin – Arley Odell Burks

I recently wrote about another branch of the *Burks* family:



In that narrative, I mentioned that there is a private Facebook group entitled "Burks and Endicott Cousins":



The administrator of this Facebook group is Wanda Burks Tackett, and her branch of the *Burks* family lived in Oklahoma for many generations. Wanda herself is originally from Checotah, Oklahoma, which is about 115 miles straight east of Oklahoma City on I-40.

Wanda recently posted a photo of her father's first cousin, Arley Odell Burks (1902-1990):



Arley lived his entire life in eastern and central Oklahoma:



In the 1930 US Census, Arley was living in Norman, Oklahoma, with his wife Ethel and their 8-year-old son Herman Royal Burks:


Interestingly, Arley and his family were living next door to his parents and five of his siblings.

At this time when Arley signed this card, he was 40 years old and living on Route #4 in Norman, Oklahoma. His occupation was listed as farming.

Here is a chart showing how Arley and I are related:



Arley and I are both descended from William Burks (1740-1830) and his wife Eliza Cade (1750-1789). I am descended from this couple through their son Levi Burks (1781-1854), while Arley is descended from this couple through their son Willis Allen Burks (1784-1870). Based on this chart, Arley and I were fourth-cousins.

As mentioned above, Arley had a son named Herman Royal Burks (1921-2009):



According to Wanda Burks Tackett's family tree on Ancestry.com, Herman had a son and a daughter. That means that Herman's son would be a *Burks* male from an unbroken string of *Burks* males going back to William Burks (1740-1830) and to his *Burks* male ancestors before him. How cool would it be to see <u>his</u> Y-DNA test and see how closely he matches other *Burks* males...

One last item: This narrative was about Arley Burks. Not to be confused with Arleigh Burke (1901-1996), who was an admiral in the United States Navy who distinguished himself during World War II and the Korean War. Arleigh Burke served as Chief of Naval Operations during the Eisenhower and Kennedy administrations. And the *Arleigh Burke* class of guided-missile destroyers is a United States Navy class of destroyer centered around the Aegis Combat System.
