B.S. - Yet Another **Oakley-Browne** Descendant

I'll skip the introduction in this narrative, because it just would be like all the other ones about my DNA matches with *Oakley-Browne* descendants. See:

I recently looked at my DNA match with Howard Bever – Howard is Tim Bever's uncle, and they both have the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment on Chromosome 15. Then I looked at <u>our</u> "Shared DNA Matches". One of them was a woman having the username of *B.S.* (managed by Korey Stump):




I share just 9 cM with **B.S.**, while Howard shares 20 cM with her.

I next looked at my DNA match with **B.S.**, and I looked at <u>our</u> "Shared DNA Matches". Here is one set of shared matches:




And here is another set of shared matches:



I recognize all of these people as descendants of the *Oakley-Browne* couple who have the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment on Chromosome 15. So at this point, I was 99.9% sure that *B.S.* also was a member of this group.

I next looked at **B.S.**'s pedigree:




Oh my! This was too easy! One of her great-grandmothers was Eva Belle Oakley, who was born in 1874.

I looked at the profile for Eva Belle Oakley in the "Korey Stump Family Tree":




This profile showed her husband and son, but not her parents. So I searched other family trees on Ancestry.com for Eva Belle Oakley. Here is a profile from the family tree owned by Robert Stemmle:



This profile has her name as "Eva Bella", and the year of her death as "Abt. 1940". Importantly, this profile has her father as Benjamin David Oakley (1832-1902). This information is consistent with what I found for Eva Belle Oakley in other family trees on Ancestry.com.

Here is a profile for Benjamin David Oakley from Robert Stemmle's family tree:



Benjamin David Oakley's father was William Oakley (1790-1854). Here is William's profile from the "Walters Family Tree":



Interesting that William M. Oakley and his wife Mercy "Marcia" Mary Farrington (1792-1869) had sons Benjamin David Oakley (1832-1902) and David Benjamin Oakley (1836-1909). Go figure!

Here is another profile for William M. Oakley:




According to these two profiles, William M. Oakley's parents were David William Oakley Jr. (1750-1829) and Eunice Oakley (1760-1848). The astute reader of my many missives will recall that this couple were "double first-cousins". Two brothers, David William Oakley (1720-1796) and William Oakley (1722-1809), married two sisters, Sarah Hunt (1724-1804) and Eunice Hunt (1730-1796). The

children of these two couples, David Oakley Jr. and Eunice Oakley, married each other. (!!) I wrote about this quite a while ago. See:

David William Oakley and his brother William Oakley were sons of Miles Oakley VI (1696-1763) and his wife Sarah Tippetts (1700-1800). And Miles VI was a great-grandson of the *Oakley-Browne* couple.

I entered the ancestral line from *B.S.* back to the *Oakley-Tippetts* couple into my RootsMagic database, and then I created the following chart showing how *B.S.* and I are related:




In the upper-left of this chart, the couples marked with the red A and red B are the two *Oakley* brothers who married the two *Hunt* sisters. David Oakley Jr., marked with the red C, was a son of couple A. Eunice Oakley, marked with the red D, was a daughter of couple B. David and Eunice, who were "double first-cousins", married. One of their sons was William M. Oakley, who was the third-great grandfather of *B.S.*

So *B.S.* is yet one more descendant of the *Oakley-Browne* couple, who lived in Saffron Walden, England, in the early 1600's. And based on all her DNA matches, it certainly appears that she has the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment on Chromosome 15.


It turns out that there are a number of descendants of William M. Oakley who appear to have the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment. I noticed this when I looked at his descendants in my RootsMagic database. Here is a screenshot with just the first part of his descendants:

I created a chart showing all of William M. Oakley's descendants who have the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment on Chromosome 15. Here is a chart showing how all of us are related:



This chart is unreadable at this magnification, so I'll display it in Landscape mode on the next page.



The DNA matches in this chart are Mark Workman and his daughter Elizabeth, Jeani Trana (Elizabeth Jean Wright), Betty Fitterman (Elizabeth Jeffares), *B.S.*, Donald Baird and his son Andrew, and my daughter Amy and me.

I find it amazing that seven people who are descendants of William M. Oakley (1790-1854) all have the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment.

The chart on the previous page also emphasizes that William M. Oakley was a son of David Oakley Jr. and his wife Eunice Oakley – the "double first-cousins".
