My New DNA Match with Jeffrey Bruce



I have been spending a lot of time recently finding descendants of Miles Oakley III (1612-1672) and his wife Mary Browne (1607-1682). This couple were my 8^{th} -great grandparents. Here are links to a number of narratives I have written recently on this topic:

One of the key people in my recent "research" is Kathy Hill Orr, who is known to have the *Oakley-Browne* DNA segment on Chromosome 15.


I'll start <u>this</u> narrative in a slightly different way. I looked at my DNA match with Kathy Hill Orr on the Ancestry.com website. Then I looked at <u>our</u> "Shared DNA Matches". And then I filtered those matches so that I only would see those matches who had at least one person in their family trees with the surname *Oakley*. This filtering process turned up three individuals – and first on this list was Jeffrey Bruce:



I have a 12 cM match with Jeffrey, while Kathy has a 22 cM match with Jeffrey.


I then looked at my DNA match with Jeffrey, and then at <u>our</u> "Shared DNA Matches". I was surprised to see so few of the usual names on this list. But we do have "Shared DNA Matches" with Victoria Vaught and Glenda Sherwood, in addition to Kathy Orr, and they are known *Oakley-Browne* descendants.

I went on to look at Jeffrey's pedigree on Ancestry.com – knowing that he had to have an *Oakley* in his tree. And here is his pedigree chart:




Oh my! Jeffrey's fourth-great grandmother was Phoebe Pugsley Oakley (1766-1854)! That sure is a name I haven't run across in the past.

Here is Jeffrey's entry for Phoebe in his family tree:



Phoebe appears in a number of family trees on Ancestry.com. Here is her profile from the "Zeller Family Tree":




Phoebe's father was Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley Sr. (1739-1794):




This profile clearly shows that Phebe Pugsley Oakley (1766-1819) was the first child of Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley and his wife Ann Oakley (1739-1819). I'm a little suspicious of this profile, since it has a total of 19 children for Thomas and his wife Ann. [Note that some trees on Ancestry.com have Thomas's wife's name as Ann, and some have Nancy Ann or Nancy Anne.]

Here is another profile for Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley:




This one only has fourteen children – still pretty incredible. But the important thing is that Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley was the father of Phebe Pugsley Oakley.

Note that Benjamin's wife was Ann Oakley (1739-1819), and she really was an *Oakley* by birth. Here is a profile for this woman (omitting all of her children except Phebe Pugsley Oakley:




Ann Oakley's father was David William Oakley (1720-1796), and he was a son of Miles Oakley VI (1696-1763) and his wife Sarah Tippetts (1700-1800).

Getting back to Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley, his father was Nehemiah Oakley (1712-1800):



And Nehemiah's father was Thomas Oakley (1678-1730):



And Thomas was a son of Miles Oakley IV (1645-1682) and his wife Mary Wilmot (1649-1698). Bingo! This connects Jeffrey Bruce back to the *Oakley-Browne* couple.

I added Jeffrey's line to my RootsMagic database, and then created a chart showing how he and I are related:




Based on this chart, Jeffrey and I are eighth-cousins once-removed.

In the chart shown above, I used the ancestral line from Phebe Pugsley Oakley that goes back through her father, Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley. Recall that Thomas' wife was Ann Oakley, and she was a daughter of David William Oakley (1720-1796) and his wife Sarah Hunt (1714-1804).

David William Oakley's parents were Miles Oakley VI (1696-1763) and his wife Sarah Tippetts (1700-1800).

This means that there were two *Oakley* lines going back from Phoebe Pugsley Oakley to Miles Oakley IV and his wife Mary Wilmot:




According to this chart, Thomas Benjamin Oakley was a great-grandson of the *Oakley-Wilmot* couple, while Thomas's wife Ann Oakley was a second-great granddaughter of the *Oakley-Wilmot* couple.

Changing gears now... This past winter, I wrote about my DNA match with Victoria Vought:

I remembered that her *Oakley* line also goes back to Pvt. Thomas Benjamin Oakley and his wife Ann Oakley. Here is a chart showing how Victoria and Jeffrey are related:



Based on this chart, Victoria and Jeffrey are sixth-cousins twice-removed.

When I looked at my DNA match with Jeffrey on Ancestry.com, I saw that Victoria was one of our "Shared DNA Matches":



I'm glad to see this finding, since it helps reinforce that our DNA matches really do back to our *Oakley* ancestors in Westchester County, New York, in early Colonial times.

One more thought: I'm puzzled that Jeffrey Bruce doesn't have more DNA matches with other known descendants of the *Oakley-Browne* couple. Perhaps he does have lots of matches, but they are too small to show up as "Shared DNA Matches" (must be at least 20 cM). Without a chromosome browser on Ancestry.com, I'll just have to leave this as something to ponder. Or something for the next generation of *Oakley* family genetic genealogists to investigate.

One last thing to add: In researching the various people in this narrative, I found a nice photo of Jeffrey's paternal grandmother, Majorie Ellen Sherwood (1922-2009):



Marjorie and my father, Burks Oakley (1898-1969), were seventh-cousins.
