
My New DNA Match with Joyce Purdy – Our Common Ancestors Go Back to the Early 1600's

On 7 April 2025, I went to the Ancestry.com website and I searched my DNA matches (now more than 55,000) for all those people who have someone in their family trees with the surname of *Oakley*:




This search produced a lot of "hits", and I scrolled down through the list of individuals until I got to someone whose name I didn't recognize – and that person was Joyce Purdy:



Joyce and I share 21 cM of DNA, and based solely on the size of this DNA match, we are likely to be something like fourth-cousins. Her family tree has just thirteen people in it, and at least one of them has to be an *Oakley*.

I next looked at Joyce's family tree (actually her pedigree chart):



Joyce's paternal grandfather's mother was Arcenith "Cena" Oakley (1879-1966). Cena Oakley is certainly someone that I hadn't encountered previously in looking at my *Oakley* family genealogy.

I immediately looked at the profile for Arcenith "Cena" Oakley in Joyce's tree:



This profile shows that Arcenith's parents are unknown (to Joyce). It also shows that Arcenith was married to Edwin Daniel Purdy (1874-1941), and as a couple, they had a son Chalmer E. Purdy (1915-1989). Based on Joyce's pedigree chart (above), Chalmer was her paternal grandfather.

In the screenshot shown above, I edited out some of the information for clarity. Here is some of the deleted information:



Arcenith "Cena" Oakley married Edwin Daniel Purdy in 1898, when she was 18 years old. She had her son Chalmer E. Purdy in 1915, when she was 35 years old. I wondered if she had any other children before her son Chalmer.

I had never heard of Arcenith "Cena" Oakley, and I naturally wondered how she (and her great-granddaughter Joyce Purdy) fit into <u>our</u> *Oakley* family (if at all). I know that a great deal of information can be gained by looking at the DNA matches that Joyce and I have in common – our so-called "Shared DNA Matches". So I went on to look at our Shared DNA Matches:



OMG! Joyce is an *Oakley* descendant and she has DNA matches with members of the *Bever* family – John Bever, Timothy Bever, and Cassidy Prentiss (Cassidy is a granddaughter of Howard Oakley Bever, and Howard is Timothy Bever's uncle).

These matches with the *Bever* family are extremely important, since I know that my DNA match with them goes all the way back to Miles Oakley (1645-1682) and his wife Mary Wilmot (1649-1698). I have written about this DNA match previously:



It is likely that this match goes back one more generation, to Miles Oakley (1612-1672) and his wife Mary Browne (1607-1682) – this is based on my DNA match with Sheryl Finch:

Using the chromosome browser on the GEDmatch.com website, I know that my DNA match with *Bever* family members is on Chromosome 15. And I know that there are other descendants of the *Oakley-Browne* couple who have part of this DNA segment on Chromosome 15. I refer to this group of people as a "triangulation group" (read the first PDF listed above to understand why).


I looked at other DNA matches that Joyce Purdy and I share. These shared matches include:



I can trace the ancestry of each of these people back to the *Oakley-Browne* couple. And those people who have their DNA on GEDmatch.com (Jeani Trana, Austin Finch, Sheryl Finch, and Anne Ely Wain) all have the matching DNA segment on Chromosome 15.


At this point, I started screaming in delight, since I was 99.9% sure that I had found another descendant of the *Oakley-Browne* couple. And this means that I was 99.9% sure that I would be able to trace Arcenith "Cena" Oakley's ancestral line back to the *Oakley-Browne* couple.

I searched on the Ancestry.com website for another profile for Arcenith "Cena" Oakley. She appears in the "Woodard Family Tree":




Cena's father was Nehemiah Myron Oakley (1834-1917). And as I suspected, Cena had five children before she had her son Chalmer in 1915.

Nehemiah is also in the "Woodard Family Tree":




Nehemiah's father was Edward Oakley (1810-1847), and Nehemiah's wife was Fannie Helena Woodard (1835-1921). I guess that is why these *Oakley* family members are in the *Woodard* family tree.

I had to do a new search for Edward Oakley. I found a good profile for him in the "Gilzeans of New Spynie..." family tree:




Edward's father was Cornelius Oakley (1790-1815). And Cornelius appears in the "Matzke" family tree:



Cornelius was born in Yonkers, Westchester County, New York, which is where my branch of the *Oakley* family lived for many generations.

Cornelius' father was Moses Hunt Oakley (1745-1801), and his profile can be found in the "Perello Family Tree":



Moses Hunt Oakley's father was David Oakley (1720-1796), and David's profile can be found in the "Oakley Project Group 1 Family Tree", which is owned by Richard Hunsaker:



I should add that Richard Hunsaker is the manager of the "Oakley Y-DNA Project" on FamilyTreeDNA.com.

David Oakley's parents were Miles Oakley (1696-1763) and Sarah Tippetts (1700-1800), and this couple were my fifth-great grandparents. Of course, Joyce Purdy and I have the same *Oakley* ancestral line going back from there – all the way to Miles Oakley (1612-1672) and his wife Mary Browne (1607-1682).

YESSSSSS!!!! Joyce Purdy is indeed descended from the Westchester *Oakleys* through her great-grandmother Arcenith "Cena" Oakley. And the fact that she has DNA matches with so many people in the "triangulation group" makes me 99.9% certain that she has the *Oakley-Browne* segment on Chromosome 15.

Now I just have to contact Joyce and ask her to put her DNA profile on the free GEDmatch.com website.
